Course information: The 7th Annual Search for the Healthy CitySM, a study tour open to anyone interested in health, will be held September 2-12, 2012 in Padua and Venice, Italy. The theme this year is *Healing through the Ages*. During this seminar participants will discuss classics of medical history and public health, visit healing and cultural sites, and examine how health systems and medical educators have responded to epidemics and plagues from the Renaissance until today. Seminar faculty includes Samuel Cohn, PhD, Professor of Medieval History at the University of Glasgow and author of the recent book *Cultures of Plague*; Giorgio Zanchin, MD, Professor at the University of Padua Medical School and President of the International Society for the History of Medicine, who will introduce us to the famous archives and anatomical theater of the oldest medical school in Europe; and Elaine Ruffolo, Professor of Art History at Syracuse University in Florence, Italy and Resident Director for the Smithsonian's Florence programs. James E. Bailey, MD, MPH, University of Tennessee Professor of Medicine, serves as Course Director.

Travel & Accommodations: After three nights in Venice we will spend a week in Padua at the Hotel Majestic Toscanelli (www.toscanelli.com), located in the historic heart of the city one block from the oldest medical school in Europe. Participants will see great artistic works of the Renaissance, enjoy the cuisine of the Veneto and Emilia-Romana regions of Italy, and visit the nearby towns of Bologna, Ravenna, and Verona.

Preliminary Itinerary:

Sunday. September 2 - Arrive **Venice**. Hotel Ala (www.hotelala.net). Welcome dinner.

Mon. September 3 - **Venice**. Boat tour around Lazzaretto Vecchio (old plague hospital) on the “Island of Death” and a walking tour of Lazzaretto Nuovo (new plague hospital). Free afternoon to explore Murano, Venice’s Island best known for glassmaking.

Tues. September 4 - **Venice**. Tour of the Redentore and Santa Maria della Salute (Basilica of St. Mary of Health), the world’s most important plague votive-offering churches.

Weds. September 5 - Morning seminar. Tour of the School of St. Rocco, “the Sistine chapel of Venice”, dedicated to Italy’s most famous healing saint. Evening arrival at in Padua at the Hotel Majestic Toscanelli (www.toscanelli.com), the main seminar location.

Thurs. September 6 - **Padua**. Morning seminar on the exhumation and analysis of Petrarch’s remains. Visit his home and tomb in the nearby village of **Arqua’ Petrarca**.

Fri. September 7 - **Bologna**. Tour the Renaissance medical school, see its famous anatomical theater and wax models; tour San Petronio Basilica and San Giacomo Maggiore.

Sat. September 8 - **Padua**. Tour Scrovegni Chapel, the Basilica of Saint Antonio of Padua, and Padua’s historic medicinal garden, the Orto Botanico. Free afternoon.

Sun. September 9 - **Ravenna**. Explore the capital of the Western Roman Empire from 402 AD and see its famous Basilicas, the Baptistry filled with mosaics, and the tomb of Dante.

Mon. September 10 - **Padua**. Morning seminar. Visit the University of Padua medical school, including the Palazzo Bo and the world-famous anatomical theater and archives.

Tues. September 11 - **Verona**. Tour the city center, including its Roman Colosseum, Basilica of San Zeno Maggiore, and other notable sites. Free time. Closing dinner.

Weds. September 12 - Departures **

Cost: The cost is \$3700 (€2825) per person (+ \$450 [€345] for single occupancy), minus \$500 (€380) or \$250 (€190) per person for registrations received by February 28 or April 30, 2012, respectively. Includes CME fees, transfers, hotel accommodations for 10 nights, meals (some lunches excluded), and all entrance fees and tour guides. Airfare and trip insurance not included.
